SKYWARN Recognition Day Turns into Activation Day

National Weather Service stations throughout the country were active on HF and VHF frequencies, on Saturday December 1, to recognize amateur radio's contribution in the SKYWARN program.

Hams activated the NWS at

Lincoln, IL and St. Louis, MO.

Usually, the month of December is relatively "quiet and uneventful."

TV broadcasters called for rain on Saturday with a marginal risk of thunderstorms with the possibility of isolated severe thunderstorms.

Around 4 pm, local time, severe thunderstorm warnings started to be issued accompanied by tornado watch and warning boxes. NWS offices in Lincoln, IL and St. Louis shifted from recognition day into SKY-WARN net mode as an outbreak of 27 tornadoes peppered central Illinois.

Macoupin county's Classic Cars was struck by an EF1 tornado on Saturday afternoon. An additional three twisters hit Montgomery county. One twister damaged farm property and the Magnuson hotel near Hwy 108 and I-55 along with Kinney Contractors before doing more damage northeast towards Raymond and onto Taylorville. Another twister did damage to farms near Butler and the other twister tracked just east of Litchfield near the water treatment plant just missing a residential area. Macoupin-Montgomery SKY-WARN net was up and gave real-time reports back to the NWS during the event. Kudos to the storm spotters checking in to give weather reports! Photos on page 8.



NWS Storm Spotter Training This Month



Hopefully, the December 1st, central Illinois tornado outbreak is fresh in you mind and you heard for yourself the importance of trained storm spotting ham radio operators participating in Skywarn to give accurate, timely, ground-truth observations back to the NWS meteorologists. Hams provide a vital link to the NWS with the ultimate goal of saving lives through early warning. Ham radio is one of the facets of the the NWS mission of a creating a"Weather Ready Nation."

Towards this goal, NWS-St. Louis will offer storm spotting classes at Blackburn College Auditorium (Bothwell Hall) on Tuesday, January 22 at 7:00 to 9:00 pm. Anyone with an interest in severe weather and wishing to be involved with the Macoupin-Montgomery County Skywarn program is urged to attend. This class should afford us to meet our new WCM, Warning Coordination Meteorologist Kevin Dietsch.

Kevin was appointed to the WCM position when Jim Kramper retired last March.








Figure D-11. Long-wire antenna.

IL NOAA NWS WX Radio Stations

Ward Silver, N0AX makes it a point to program his VHF/UHF FM radios with the seven frequencies nationally assigned to NWS so that when he is on the road he is within the coverage area of a NWS transmitter. These frequencies are 162.400, 162.425. 162.450, 162.475, 162.500, 162.525 and 162.550. Keep in mind that not all NWS transmitters have the same output power. For instance, KD089 out of St. Louis and WXJ75 out of Springfield, IL have 1000 watts; whereas, KXI79 in Hillsboro runs 300 watts. A good URL to see the various NWS stations and their respective output power is

Besides being up to date with the latest NWS information these stations can also serve as good VHF propagation beacons. Listen to the various frequencies and see where and how well the station is coming in to your location.

Springtime and summer months brings enhanced VHF propagation during the morning and evening hours.
